







# COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL PRESCRIPTIVE REBATE PROGRAM – LIGHTING



## Program Rules and Equipment Eligibility Requirements

1. Work must be completed via self-install or by a contractor (licensed if required). If you do not have a contractor, please visit [www.energizingindiana.com](http://www.energizingindiana.com) to view a list of participating contractors.
2. Customer must be classified as and served under a commercial or industrial rate.
3. All installed measures must be new. No refurbished measures will be accepted.
4. The customer must have an active account with a participating utility in the state of Indiana. The upgraded facility must be located in the state of Indiana and within a participating utility's service territory.
5. The application must be received within 60 days of project completion.
6. The approved rebate will be processed and mailed within 45 days of the application's receipt.
7. All applications are subject to on-site inspection.
8. Rebate checks will only be mailed to the customer's or contractor's mailing address as indicated on this application.
9. The amount and availability of rebates are subject to change. The program funding is limited and available on a first come, first served basis.
10. Only one account number per application is accepted. If upgrades are made across multiple account numbers, then separate applications must be made reflecting the quantities associated with each account number.
11. A maximum of \$20,000 in rebate dollars per account/premise number for each program year is allowed. Each account/premise would be eligible for the maximum amount each program year. Any requested rebate amounts in excess of \$20,000 will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
12. Projects that are not eligible for a rebate include:
  - a. Fuel switching
  - b. Changes in operation or maintenance practices
  - c. Projects that shift peak usage rather than energy savings
  - d. On-site electricity generation
13. Lighting fixtures and lamps must operate a minimum of 1,500 hours annually.
14. Leased equipment is not eligible.
15. The rebate recipient assumes all responsibilities for any tax consequences resulting from rebate payment.
16. Rebates may not exceed the cost of the installed measures.
17. Additional rebates may be available directly from your utility for equipment not covered by the Energizing Indiana Commercial and Industrial Prescriptive Rebate Program. Please visit your utility's website for additional information.
